

SOCIAL CARE NETWORK



A social care network (SCN) will be a network of community-based organizations (CBOs) responsible for delivering high-quality, evidence-based, and accessible social care services. The network will be administered by a lead entity that will coordinate the delivery of social care services by CBOs to Medicaid members with shared data & technology between the SCN, CBOs, NYS, and other stakeholders, to help evaluate the impact on health outcomes.

1115 Waiver At A Glance

- **Purpose of SCN:** Delivering top-tier, evidence-based social care to the community.
- **Significant Funding:** \$31.4M allocated for the CNY region to bolster our community services.
- **Your Role:** An invitation to non-profits to join and enrich this vibrant network.
- **Who Can Lead:** 501c3 non-profits, including CBOs, IPAs, Health Homes, BHCCs, FQHCs, or PPSs with at least 3 years of experience working with CBOs in the application region.

For a CBO to be part of a SCN, it must:

ELIGIBILITY

- Be a not-for-profit charitable organization that works at the local level to meet community needs and is registered as a 501(c)(3)
- Must provide at least navigation or one of the Enhanced HRSN Services in a coverage area that is part of the SCN's region.
- For-profit organizations will need to be approved by the State & only included if there isn't a nonprofit available.

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REIMBURSEMENT
HRSN SERVICES

CBOs within the SCN will have access to Medicaid reimbursement for providing "Enhanced HRSN services" including:

- Screening with the Accountable Health Communities HRSN screening tool
- Navigation & Case Management
- Housing Support: Community Transitional Supports, Utility Set up / Assistance, Rent/temporary housing for up to 6 months, Pre-tenancy and tenancy sustaining services, Home remediation, Home accessibility and safety modifications, & Medical respite
- Nutrition Services: Nutritional counseling and classes, Home Delivered Meals, Medically Tailored Meals (MTM), Fruit and vegetable prescription, Pantry Stocking & Cooking Supplies
- Transportation: Public & Private Transportation to the above services

Medicaid reimbursement (up to \$3.173M statewide and est. \$200M in CNY) for these services will be limited to Medicaid beneficiaries enrolled in Medicaid managed care who meet certain criteria such as:

- Medicaid high utilizers
- Individuals enrolled in a New York state designated Health Home
- Individuals with SUD
- Individuals with serious mental illness
- Individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities
- Individuals who meet the Department of Housing and Urban Development's definition of homeless
- Pregnant persons, up to 12 months postpartum
- Post-release criminal justice-involved population with serious chronic conditions, SUD, or chronic Hepatitis-C
- Juvenile justice involved youth, foster care youth, and those under kinship care
- Children under the age of 6, and,
- Children under the age of 18 with one or more chronic conditions

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
